Early 2015 the Grand Canyon University got a lease to run the municipal golf course of the city of Phoenix. The university funded the project and invested in a complete renovation. They just do not like it

The property is situated on 130 acres. When needed, the designated person on call walks around during dusk or dawn to scare away geese. "We are located in the Arizona dessert which means very bright sunlight during the day, making the laser less effective. But at the start or end of the day the

geese run off when you hit them with the laser. They just do not like it."
